## **What is RAC?**

The “Recognition of Acquired Competencies” (RAC) is a process that allows adults to be evaluated and to obtain official recognition for competencies (skills and knowledge) acquired on the job or through real-life experience.

## **What are the advantages of RAC?**

- Helps you get evaluated for skills you already know
- Provides official recognition of your competencies
- Improves your employability
- Is flexible to suit your schedule and your lifestyle.

## **Which diploma do I get?**

Upon completion of the RAC Cisco Certified Network Associate process, you will be awarded an AEC (Attestation of Collegial Studies) recognized by the Minister of Higher Education.

The program will also prepare candidates to successfully complete the industry-recognized CISCO CCNA certification.


## **Is this AEC for me?**

This AEC is for candidates who are already working in the IT field and who have substantial knowledge in networking fundamentals.

## **How long does it take?**

The duration is approximately 3 to 4 months. The training activities are offered on Monday and Wednesday evenings and on Saturdays.

## How much does it cost?



- All applicants must pay the 30\$ application fee and 45\$ file analysis fee before moving forward to the next step; the Validation Interview. This 75\$ is non-refundable and must be paid online with a credit card.
- Applicants who have previously attended Champlain College will not be charged the 30\$ application fee.

\*Candidates may be required to do take other trainings in some areas of the program. Additional fees may apply.

## What are the admission requirements?

To be admissible for this AEC program, applicants must meet the eligibility requirements of the *Règlement sur le régime des études collégiales* that are in effect at the time of admission as well as the College requirements:

- Candidates must be 20 years of age or older and have been absent from full-time CEGEP studies for at least one year prior to admission to the program.
- Candidates must have a High School Diploma or experience and training deemed sufficient by the College Administration.
- Candidates must have attained a certain level of mastery of the English language, in order to be able to deal with the course materials.


## What are the competencies?

The Cisco Certified Network Associate AEC consists of 7 competencies:

<b>BJ1P</b>	Analyze the fundamentals of networking
<b>BJ2P</b>	Configure switches for use in a small network
<b>BJ3P</b>	Configure routers for use in a small network
<b>BJ4P</b>	Implement wireless devices in a small to medium-sized LAN network
<b>BJ5P</b>	Configure router security functionality for complex networks
<b>BJ6P</b>	Analyze protocols, services and related technologies in small to medium-sized networks
<b>BJ7P</b>	Design a medium-sized network based on client needs
